Fire

Fire size is 35,195 acres at 36% containment. Moderate fire behavior is expected today moving into extreme conditions tomorrow. Firing operations (to protect nearby residential areas) will continue today.

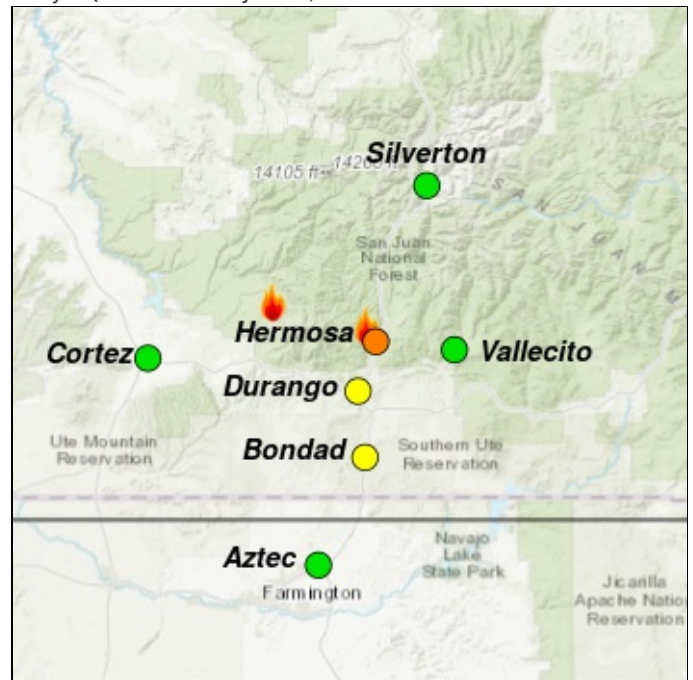
Smoke

Smoke will continue to impact downwind communities along the Animas River drainage late this afternoon and overnight. Clearing is expected by late tomorrow morning in these communities.

Hermosa			Smoke settling in tonight approaching Unhealthy levels before lifting by mid-morning		
Vallecito			May see Moderate levels of smoke late this afternoon/early evening, clearing by midnight		
Durango	No hourly data		Unhealthy levels of smoke settling in overnight, lifting by mid-morning today and tomorrow		
Silverton			Hazy conditions possible this afternoon, greater smoke impacts expected tomorrow		
Aztec			Moderate smoke concentrations may drift into this area late tonight, clearing mid-morning		

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Air Quality Index (AQI)	Actions to Protect Yourself
Good	None
Moderate	Unusually sensitive individuals should consider limiting prolonged or heavy exertion.
USG	People within Sensitive Groups* should reduce prolonged or heavy outdoor exertion.
Unhealthy	People within Sensitive Groups* should avoid all physical outdoor activity.
Very Unhealthy	Everyone should avoid prolonged or heavy exertion.
Hazardous	Everyone should avoid any outdoor activity.
